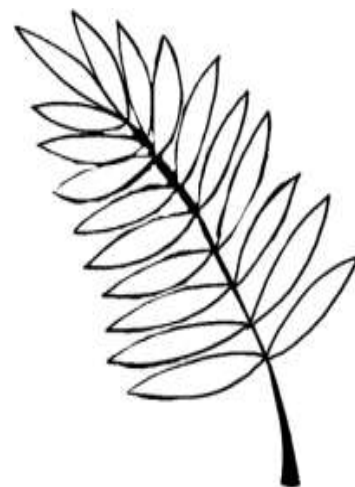

From the Dean

Each year during Holy Week, in the community of Cartersville, Georgia, USA, there is a march for Immigrant Solidarity. Immigrants – mostly from Mexico and Central America, along with those in the community who support them, gather for a walk from a Methodist church to a Catholic church, a journey of several miles. They carry a cross similar to the size of the one on which Jesus was executed. They sing. They remember the one who was in a parade that was also political. They walk through areas that are not welcoming. Churches along the way open their doors for hospitality. Christians and others in Australia too march to support refugees and asylum seekers. How might these parades mirror the parade of Palm Sunday? How might Palm Sunday be opening our eyes to see the life and death of Christ in a new way?

Roller coasters are endless loops, yet there is a beginning and an end. There are peaks and valleys, with one great big high point, drops, and spaces in between to allow us to catch our breath. Some even have parts that are dark and scary. Roller coaster offers an image for the liturgical year.

Liturgically, the church begins our ride on the first Sunday of Advent with the slow climb towards the top of the first big hill – Christmas. We descend through Epiphany into Ash Wednesday and the contemplative period of Lent before we begin to climb again towards Palm Sunday. Then we go down into the depths of darkness before climbing into the daylight that is Easter. There is then the rush of Pentecost, and the quiet part in the middle – Ordinary Time – the chance to catch our breath, look around at the scenery – maybe see some water, wave at the people standing in line, and then the last hills of All Saint’s Day, Christ the King Sunday and the ride is over. We begin the ride again with the first Sunday of Advent.

But before we get to Easter, the one we are so excited about – the peak with the spectacular view and the adrenaline rush – we have to descend into Holy Week. We drop down into deep places; we look at each other and ask hard questions about betrayal, and eat last meals. To truly understand how amazing it is to be at the heights that are Easter morning, we must also experience the depths that are Holy Week. *(Some thoughts from ‘Seasons of the Spirit’)*

How are you preparing for the ride into Holy Week?

We have been through ups and downs and much prayer. Will you journey with us to the cross and beyond?

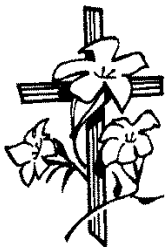
