### **A Reading from The Letter to the Hebrews**

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins.

He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness;

and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people.

And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

‘You are my Son,

today I have begotten you’;

as he says also in another place,

‘You are a priest for ever,

according to the order of Melchizedek.’

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.

Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered;

and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him,

having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek. *Hebrews 5.1-10*

**Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.' When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. From the dean

Nikolai is leading services at Port Albert, Yarram and Golden Beach and being here for Messy Church today.

I am leading a retreat in Grafton, NSW, and back home tomorrow. I am thinking of you all. Thank you to Rev'd Heather for taking services at St Pauls' this morning.

It has been another fruitful year at the Cathedral Parish. The image I have for the cathedral at the moment is of new fruit just forming on the branches. The blossoms have come and gone. It is late Spring, now we need to continue to water and fertilise so the fruit can grow and eventually ripen. We are in exciting and encouraging times with new faces enlivening our worship, and people exploring their callings in prayerful considered ways. The fruit is forming.

Today is **Vocations Sunday** when we consider what it is God is calling us to today. I remember exploring a vocation to ordained ministry. I resisted and resisted. When the first women were ordained, I had a vision that it was me going forward, but I argued, "just because they do it doesn't mean I have to! "I want to get married and have children", I argued, so I'm not committed enough.. excuses, excuses, until someone said, "you can do both you know". Oh, my excuse was swept away.. for me, ordination was a path to freedom and love, and for me, the way I can be most fully myself, and most fully serve God, and it has been a delight and privilege.

In my diary on the eve of my ordination to the diaconate on 23<sup>rd</sup> December 1989, I wrote:

Lord,  
I come to you as a free person.  
I freely choose to give my life to you  
I know you have called me to this office  
But I have been free to accept or reject the offer  
Now I freely choose it and am grateful for the privilege.  
There have been times when I have been angry  
And fought against you, in fear.

Now, in awe and fear for your majesty, I come to you in love  
To give, to have and to hold,  
for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health til in  
death we are fully united.

As a bride before the altar after many years of preparation  
of your patient waiting,  
I come...

The prayer concludes on a realistic yet humorous note:

It is the end and the beginning of a long hard struggle,  
for now I am free and I choose life, clerical collar and all!

The call to priesthood for me is the call to life, to freedom, to love, to sharing the  
intimacy of relationships with God and with others. It is also about embodiment, about  
being a God person and imaging the divine in my humanity.

The whole of creation is being called by God to ministry. You need to discern your  
place in this calling, in other words, how and to what is God calling you today?  
The fruit is forming.
