The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.' But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed

because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.' Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name. *John 20.19-31* For the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**

Reflection Coming to Faith as Easter people. Easter 2.

We can only imagine how traumatized were the disciples following the crucifixion of their Master. Behind locked doors, huddled together, fearful, acutely aware of their inability to support Him when at his most vulnerable. Then Jesus is in their midst. His forgiveness comes in the words "peace be with you" (v.19). Jesus showed that resurrection was an experience of forgiveness and that extracting revenge was not part of the vocabulary of the Kingdom Ethic. He wanted his disciples to know that he was really alive, that his suffering was real and to feel and to know in their hearts, his divine peace. The dawning of a new humanity was to begin with them, (with us his baptized), the hallmarks of which were deep peace and forgiveness.

As John states: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." (v:22). By breathing on them the Holy Spirit they were commissioned to live the same mission, to show a way that was very different in a largely indifferent world. The reading from Acts records their shift in attitude, they have been transformed from fearful disciples to intrepid men (and women) whom the authorities, the then 'powers that be' could not silence.

The story of Thomas raises interesting points. It gave permission for generations of Christians to express doubts and fears experienced along their journey of faith. For Thomas, his recorded (v:25) uncertainty was perhaps, more a disbelief in the crucifixion, as how could he believe in an executed Messiah? We know the hope at the time was for a Messiah who would turn the tables on their violent oppressors and overthrow (with violence). Jesus however showed that sanctioned violence was not the Kingdom Way. Jesus raises violence on the cross, destroys its power and commissions us to examine and practice, an alternative way to live a life; to understand that the way to cure violence is to completely refrain from doing it. Perhaps we can dare to name that the greatest sin in our world is believing otherwise? That it is acceptable to show forms of violence in racism, economic deprivation, greed, in all the processes that create a 'them and us' culture? Resurrection, to live as 'Easter people' takes time and can never be a one-time event. It is an experience we grow into and it is through our relationships and the circumstances of our lives that it grows. The communal way in which we grow in our faith is an important focus in this reading. Coming to Christian faith is a shared process of trust, of mutual support, of fellowship, of learning, and edifying through teaching. We are in the same position as Thomas, our knowledge of these events is

not firsthand but relayed through the whole canon of Scripture. We are the committed Christians who have not seen and yet have come to believe. Liam Matthews
