A Reading from the Acts to the Apostles

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?' Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat." But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth." But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved." And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?' When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.'

When he had gone out, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, "Where I am going, you cannot come." I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.' *John 13.31-35*

For the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Reflection on the 5th Sunday after Easter.

We are invited to sit with Jesus and his disciples as they share their final meal in the Upper Room and to hear, following Judas' departure, the new commandment that Jesus gives his disciples (John 13:34) "just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." In the biblical tradition, to love was to act for the good of others and was central to Judaism (Deuteronomy 6:4; Leviticus 19:18). Jesus lived love, demonstrated love, acted with tenderness, compassion, sensitivity and profound understanding of the human condition. So then why was Jesus considered more dangerous than the patriot and insurrectionist Barabbas? Jesus' manifesto was Good News however to live it he crossed boundaries, broke the purity laws, associated with sinners, sought table-fellowship with the ritually unclean and healed untouchables. A 'dangerous' love that reached out to the 'other', crossed safe boundaries and was inclusive. This manner of 'love' is what was new in his commandment and is what was viewed as 'dangerous' by the powers that were.

When we abide in our love it is too easy to intensify this love and hate those outside our group; the Church has a long history of excluding and even killing those with whom it has disagreed. We have used the Bible to support many forms of injustice. The twist in the new commandment is that it is incarnational, it invites us to love as God loves, to stand in a different place, in a different state of being, in a different energy, animated by his Spirit. It is a gift by the one who commands its practice. Jesus modelled this kind of love "as I have loved you". The disciples experienced it with Him so they knew how, (but like us in our contexts) had to keep practicing. The early Church in the Acts expands Jesus' mission by bringing together Jewish and gentile peoples and what is descried in these pages, is the scope of grace and salvation made available to all peoples everywhere. Our ways are not God's ways. There is a "wideness to God's mercy" that far exceeds our own. If we abide in Christ's love, then our agape expands and expands for it is no longer our love, but Christ's that moves in and through us.
