A Reading from the Acts to the Apostles

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.' When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them. We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, 'If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home.' And she prevailed upon us.

A Reading from Book of Revelation

And in the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. It has the glory of God and a radiance like a very rare jewel, like jasper, clear as crystal. It has a great, high wall with twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels, and on the gates are inscribed the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites; on the east three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. And the wall of the city has twelve foundations, and on them are the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb. I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the

Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honour of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practises abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life. Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever. *Revelation* 21.10-14,21.22 - 22.5

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus answered him, 'Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me. 'I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, "I am going away, and I am coming to you." If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe. *John 14.23-29*

Reflection for the 6th Sunday after Easter

The Gospel passage for today is indeed profound in its depth and complexity. Jesus spoke to his gathered disciples words of immense comfort, words of invitation and commitment, a shalom that was not from the world, and a promise of an eternal, intimate and constant presence to guide, advise, strengthen and uphold for the journey of discipleship. We sense the situation in that upper room pulsating with tension as their beloved master and friend spoke of his impending absence.

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." ... "Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." (14:27). A massive contrast to the *Pax Romana* of the day where violence or threat thereof was the reality of their social and

political context. The terrors of the world could not cancel the shalom Jesus gives in gift. This peace can never be destroyed by hardship and difficulties as it is a well-being grounded in God.

Jesus says that He and the Father will come and make their dwelling with those who love Him and keep His word (14:23) and that He will come back to the community (14:28). This ongoing presence of Jesus refers to the promised Holy Spirit/ Advocate to teach and remind, of the Kingdom Way he established (14:26). The Spirit, to be continuously engaged in the work of remembering and theological reformulation for each generation.

It is with centred prayer and the aid of the Holy Spirit that we begin to see how God might be working for good, even in the midst of terrible and confusing events. John's Gospel sees the death of Jesus in the light of the resurrection, in the light of God's triumph over evil and death. The Spirit assures us that we are never abandoned, even in the midst of loss, pain, and sorrow that are part of life in this broken world. Above all else, it is this profound love of God that Jesus has made known to his disciples and to us his baptized, and that the Holy Spirit continues to make known to us. For John, eternal Life begins here and now, in our life in relationship with God through Jesus (17:3).

To conclude with Psalm 67, a psalm that reflects on all the gifts of life. God's blessings touch all creation, as just to 'be' is a blessing. Life in its complexity is birthed from God's hand and God guides each moment of experience. Liam Matthews Locum Acting Dean.
