A Reading from the Book of Daniel

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another. As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: 'As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom for ever—for ever and ever.' *Daniel 7.1-3, 15-18* Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

A Reading from The Letter to the Ephesians

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory. I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love towards all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Dean's Reflection

Today we commemorate All Saints/All Souls. This is one of my favourite festivals for a whole host of reasons. Many of us never forget those whom we've loved who have died; many folk have recounted to me over the years a sense of their loved ones still being with them — whether as a warm memory, or someone conversed with mentally, or even as a presence. We all experience these things differently — and there's some reticence to talk about it, lest we're seen as crazy.

But All Saints gives us permission to bring our loved ones to mind. It reminds us that we are part of the "great cloud of witnesses" who have gone before us, and with whom we are still connected. A well-respected bishop of my acquaintance reminded a seminar a few years ago that though our loved ones — the saints — are dead to us, yet they are alive in Christ. We are people of resurrection; we believe that those who die are in the hands of God and nothing evil can touch them. So at All saints we remember and celebrate this precious truth: death is not the end of the story.

During the service today you'll be invited to light a candle and name those people you carry in your heart. If you can't be at church, why not do something similar at home, light a candle and remember.

- 1.) It is 15 years since Delbridge Hall was opened and with a recent generous donation, we have been able to **fully pay off the loan**. THANK YOU to all who have used money boxes and donated via the 'Brick' money boxes and other donations, over \$18,000 in total. The loan was supposed to be paid out in March 2025! This has also saved \$4870 in interest payments.
- 2.) We have received a bequest for \$50,000

- 4.) The financial year has ended very positively. AGM report next week.
- 5.) Chapter is delighted to announce that we have received a **Sustainability Victoria grant of \$8,155 to install solar panels on Delbridge Hall**. This will significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions from the Cathedral complex, as well as greatly reducing the cost of our electricity.

This project is supported by the Community Climate Change and Energy Action program, which is delivered by Sustainability Victoria on behalf of the Victorian Government.

We are also grateful for the support of the Gippsland Power Hub, which alerted us to this grant, paid for our energy audit, and provided helpful advice.

The grant will pay for close to half of the final cost of the solar system.

Chapter is now inviting donations towards the remaining cost of \$\frac{\$7155}{}\$, the total after donations already received. Donations can be made via internet bank transfer (identify as 'solar'), or via an envelope in the offertory marked 'solar'.

Tax deductible donations may be made by direct transfer to Anglican Earthcare Gippsland: Correct details for this coming soon.

We hope to have the solar system up and running by the end January 2023.
