A Reading from the Prophet Jeremiah

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.’ Then he said, ‘Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.’ He replied, ‘Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.’ *Luke 23.33-43*

Dean’s Reflection

Today we celebrate Christ the King, the last Sunday in the liturgical year. It’s also the day of our parish Annual General Meeting, when we reflect on the year that has been, and set our sights on the new year as it’s about to unfold.

In the eyes of the world, of course, it’ll be another month before the tv retrospectives which review the significant news events of the year start to be advertised.

But we begin that process now, as we head into Advent, starting a new church year with a period of preparation to commemorate the First Coming, while reflecting seriously on the prospect of the Second Coming. First, today, we remember Christ the King.

I like this feast because in some ways we get to celebrate Ascension over again; the Ascension is a feast forty days after Easter which gets skated over in the rush to Pentecost. Because it happens on a Thursday, sometimes we don’t even observe it! So today we reflect on the Risen and Ascended Lord, who was and is and is to come. We stand with him as we look back on the year that has been, and it’s in his presence we set intentions for the year to come, knowing that he is the Lord of Time, the one in whose hand all things move and because of whom all things have their being.

At the same time, he’s not an ordinary King in the temporal sense. Because the Kingship of Christ is not about reigning with an iron sceptre, lording it over all and expecting all to fall on their faces before him although scripture suggests every knee shall bow. This king surrenders his power – a pattern throughout his earthly life, and a pattern that continues in the continuance of existence itself. This is a king who’s vulnerable, and lays down his life because of love – for his father, for the world he sustains. This is a king who demands nothing, but whose actions ask everything of us in response: my heart, my soul, my all.

In this year as it unfolds, may we have grace to surrender what we have done and left undone, a look to how in the days ahead we may live after the pattern of Christ our King.
