For the Lord's sake accept the authority of every human institution, whether of the emperor as supreme,

or of governors, as sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to praise those who do right.

As servants of God, live as free people, yet do not use your freedom as a pretext for evil.

Honour everyone. Love the family of believers. Fear God. Honour the emperor. Slaves, accept the authority of your masters with all deference, not only those who are kind and gentle but also those who are harsh.

For it is to your credit if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly.

If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, where is the credit in that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval.

For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps.

and no deceit was found in his mouth.'

When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly.

He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed.

This weekend retreat will introduce you to the Enneagram, a powerful way to understand your personality, moving from ways of being that constrict you, towards a healthier way of living. You will look at the core motivations of your life, the healthy messages that you have missed, and how these have informed your life till now. During this weekend, you will discover the gifts that you bring to the world and begin (or continue) a journey of honouring these gifts in your life and community. You are also likely to gain some insight into various ways that people in your life experience the world differently from the way you do and learn how to better empathise with both you and others.

Julia, a mother and grandmother, is a Gestalt therapist and spiritual director. She brings a wealth of training and experience to this weekend retreat. Julia first read a book on the Enneagram when her children were small. It gave her a template from which to understand and encourage each of her children in their uniqueness. Years later, having become a therapist herself, she rediscovered the Enneagram and was trained in it by Helen Palmer and David Daniels, both pioneers in the Enneagram traditions. Since her training, Julia has continued to learn and to use the Enneagram to gain deeper understanding of herself and a more empathic understanding of those who populate her world.
