A Reading from The Acts of The Apostles

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.' Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. O sing to God, sing praises to his name: glorify him that rode through the deserts, him whose name is the Lord, and exult before him. He is the father of the fatherless. he upholds the cause of the widow: God in his holy dwelling place. He gives the desolate a home to dwell in, and brings the prisoners out into prosperity: but rebels must dwell in a barren land. O God, when you went out before your people: when you marched through the wilderness, The earth shook, the heavens poured down water: before the God of Sinai, before God, the God of Israel. You showered down a generous rain, O God: you prepared the land of your possession when it was weary. And there your people settled: in the place that your goodness, O God, had made ready for the poor. Sing to God, you kingdoms of the earth: O sing praises to the Lord, To him that rides upon the highest heavens, that were from the beginning: who utters his voice, which is a mighty voice. Ascribe power to God, whose majesty is over Israel: and his might is in the clouds. Terrible is God who comes from his holy place: the God of Israel who gives power and strength to his people. Blessed be God.

A Reading from The First Letter of Peter

Now as an elder myself and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as one who shares in the glory to be revealed, I exhort the elders among you

to tend the flock of God that is in your charge, exercising the oversight, not under compulsion but willingly, as God would have you do it—not for sordid gain but eagerly.

Do not lord it over those in your charge, but be examples to the flock.

And when the chief shepherd appears, you will win the crown of glory that never fades away.

In the same way, you who are younger must accept the authority of the elders. And all of you must clothe yourselves with humility in your dealings with one another, for

'God opposes the proud,

but gives grace to the humble.'

Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, so that he may exalt

you in due time.

Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you.

Discipline yourselves; keep alert. Like a roaring lion your adversary the devil prowls around, looking for someone to devour.

Resist him, steadfast in your faith, for you know that your brothers and sisters throughout the world are undergoing the same kinds of suffering.

And after you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, support, strengthen, and establish you.

To him be the power for ever and ever. Amen.

for you". And we reflect on Jesus the Master modelling for us what intimate prayer to his Father looks like, prayer in which we too are caught up as he prays for us. Let us remember, in these perplexing days, that the One who loves us has gone ahead of us to intercede for us, and that as our lips and hearts cry out, he cries out with us.

- In your prayer today, place your anxieties and the things that bother you in God's gentle hands. Pray, confident that Jesus prays in you.

Newton College is in the Northern Province of PNG, located between Kokoda and the coast. It is the only place where the Anglican Church of PNG provides primary formation for its ordinands. Each student is allocated a garden and most of the food they eat is from these gardens.

College fees are 2000 kina each year (around 450 AUD depending on currency fluctuations). **Our \$1000 a year support** meets half of the student fees and provides a small allowance of 150 kina a month (\$60) for married students and their families, 100 kinas a month (45AUD) for single students. This enables them to buy

small items like soap and rice and to pay school fees. The students do it tough and every bit of support makes an enormous difference.
