#### A Reading from The Acts of the Apostles

News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for an entire year they associated with the church and taught a great many people, and it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called 'Christians'. At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world; and this took place during the reign of Claudius. The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers living in Judea; this they did, sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul. Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the ruler, and Saul. While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off. Acts 11.22-30; 13.1-3 Thanks be to God. Hear the word of the Lord.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment. Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts, no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff; for labourers deserve their food. Whatever town or village you enter, find out who in it is worthy, and stay there until you leave. As you enter the house, greet it. If the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; but if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you.

Matthew 10.7-13 For the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ** 

#### Reflection: (by members of St Paul's during May – July)

The name of Barnabas is associated strongly with that of the Apostle Paul.

We celebrate saints because they model for us what it looks like to live lives shaped by our baptismal calling. Barnabas is named as a teacher and prophet, a good man, "full of the Holy Spirit and faith". What a testament to this man's ministry! Perhaps he was also modelling in this the other exhortation Jesus gives in today's gospel reading: to take nothing for the journey except faith, to stay where the disciples he was exhorting were welcomed, and to come and go in peace.

- Pray for those who are prophets and teachers in the church. Pray that God will raise up more people for these ministries.
- Offer prayerfully your own intention and work to be blessed by God.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Anglican Church of Melanesia, remembering especially the priests and people of St Barnabas' Provincial Cathedral, Honiara

#### Month of June Mission: Mission to Seafarers

The Mission to Seafarers is an international mission of the Anglican Church which cares for the practical and spiritual welfare of seafarers of all nationalities and faiths.

There are 230 mission sites around the world, and four centres in Victoria at Melbourne, Portland, Geelong and Hastings. The work is carried out by a small number of staff, chaplains and volunteers who give freely of their time 365 days of the year.

Each centre houses the 'Flying Angel Club' where seafarers are welcomed by a friendly face and can contact their families by phone or internet, and receive counselling during times of injustice or distress.

The Mission to Seafarers Victoria ship visiting program supports crew who do not receive shore leave and is a vital service to ensure these crew have the provisions and support they require.

While most seafarers are well treated, some are still abandoned in ports far from their homes, or remain unpaid or forced to work in unsafe or unacceptable conditions. In such situations, the Mission plays a vital role in providing practical care and moral support.
