A Reading from The Prophet Isaiah

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations.

He will not cry or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street;

a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice.

He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his teaching.

Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it:

I am the LORD, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.

I am the LORD, that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols.

A Reading from The Acts of the Apostles

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ - he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.' Acts 10.34-43

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, 'I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?'But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfil all righteousness.' Then he consented. And when Jesus had been baptized, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he

saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.'

Dean's Reflection

This week, being the Sunday after Epiphany, we observe the Baptism of Christ. Why is this important? The story as we hear it from Matthew's gospel is incredibly carefully constructed, the voice from heaven, the hovering dove, the words declared, even the water of baptism itself, and the concept of "righteousness" all drawing on so many resonances from the Jewish scriptures (our Old Testament). Matthew is at pains to demonstrate in his gospel Jesus as the representative of Israel and its heir, the long-desired Davidic King. Jesus is also the New Moses, the one who gives the new law. Jesus' baptism in some ways is an act of new creation: just as in creation the Spirit hovered over the surface of the deep to bring new life and light, so now the Spirit descends like a dove, and Jesus himself is the one who brings things into being and makes all things new.

This, in spite of John's protests that he should be the one asking to be baptised by Jesus, not the other way around. Not least because, while Matthew never explicitly states it, there are attestations to Jesus' sinlessness in many other places in the New Testament; if he hadn't sinned, why would he need to be baptised? "To fulfill all righteousness." Righteousness here is about right relationship, about Jesus consciously putting himself in the place of humankind, and mending what was damaged and broken between God and creation.

As we celebrate Jesus' Baptism we're reminded of our own baptism: that we have been united with Jesus to stand with him in that relationship of rightness he brings about, and that we too therefore hear the voice declaring, "This is my son/daughter, with whom I am well pleased," and know the descent of the Heavenly Dove to hover over us with blessing.




The DVDs are popular, People are happy to look under the table for those that don't fit. 25 for \$6 was not enough for one man, 4 boxes and 3 bags later....
