## A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah

Listen to me, O coastlands,

pay attention, you peoples from far away!

The Lord called me before I was born,

while I was in my mother's womb he named me.

He made my mouth like a sharp sword,

in the shadow of his hand he hid me;

he made me a polished arrow,

in his quiver he hid me away.

And he said to me, 'You are my servant,

#### A Reading from The First Letter to the Corinthians

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes, To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind— just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you— so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. *1 Corinthians 1.1-9* Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and declared, 'Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, "After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me." I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.' And John testified, 'I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit." And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.' The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, 'Look, here is the Lamb of God!' The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' (which translated means Teacher), 'where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come and see.' They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas' (which is translated Peter). John 1.29-42

For the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

#### Dean's Reflection

I've been pondering gratitude this week: that practice we're advised to make a habit, until our dominant response to the world, to others, to God is one of thankfulness.

But I've also been thinking about how we acknowledge and thank the people around us for what they do for and with us and on our behalf.

So what jumped out at me from the second reading for today from 1 Corinthians is Paul's opening gambit: "I give thanks to my God always for you." And the reason for that thankfulness is that the Corinthian Christians have been "enriched" through their encounter with Jesus, and therefore have all the spiritual gifts their community needs. That's an extraordinary statement! Imagine if that was said about us, here in the cathedral parish? I thank God always for you, for the blessing you are; that you radiate the presence of Christ, and the goodness of God to me/us/the wider community. In fact, I have heard a few people say something similar! I wonder whether we are able to hear that thankfulness and own what it represents...

I also wonder whether Paul's thankfulness for the Corinthians was about who they were at that point, or about who they were becoming. Because the first letter to the Corinthians deals with some pretty serious (and petty) divisions in the community, especially around spiritual gifts, and some instances of rude behaviour ill-befitting a group of Jesus' followers – like people being greedy, and some getting communion while others missed out. These are realities in most human communities. Paul is at pains in his letter to the Corinthians to get them to stop thinking hierarchically but rather organically: we are all part of each other, and we flourish or fade together. So it's in our best interests, he suggests, to get along, to be kind to one another – to show our gratitude and thankfulness for each other's gifts rather than tearing each other down.

How can we create a culture of thanksgiving for one another here in our patch? Who can you show thankfulness and gratitude to this week?
