## **LITURGY OF THE PALMS**

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

**Hosanna in the highest.**

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

This morning begins the Great Week of the Christian Year.

During Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of the Lord's death and resurrection.

With Christians throughout the world,

we come together this week to call to mind,

and to express in word and action,

the centre of the Easter mystery:

our Lord's Passover from death to life.

Christ entered in triumph into the Holy City

to complete his work as Messiah:

to suffer, to die and to rise to new life.

Today we commit ourselves to walk the way of the cross,

so that, sharing his sufferings,

we may be united with him in his risen life.

*All may hold up their palms for this blessing, said by the presider.*

Sovereign God,

we thank you for these palm branches palm crosses.

By your +blessing may they be for us signs of the victory of your Son.

May we who carry them in his name ever hail him as our Messiah,

and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life;

who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,

one God, for ever and ever.           **Amen.**

### **The Palm Gospel**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke, chapter 19, beginning at verse 28.

#### **Hosanna in the highest.**

***Narrator:*** As Jesus came near Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two disciples ahead with these instructions:

***Jesus:*** Go to the village there ahead of you; as you go in, you will find a colt tied up that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If someone asks you why you are untying it, tell him that the Master needs it.

***Narrator:*** They went on their way and found everything just as Jesus had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners said to them:

***Owner:*** Why are you untying it?

***Narrator:*** They answered:

***Disciple:*** The Master needs it.

***Narrator:*** And they took the colt to Jesus. Then they threw their cloaks over the animal and helped Jesus get on. As he rode on, people spread their cloaks on the road.

When he came near Jerusalem, at the place where the road went down the Mount of Olives, the large crowd of his disciples began to thank God and praise him in loud voices for all the great things that they had seen:

***Crowd:*** Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!  
Peace in heaven and glory to God!

***Narrator:*** Then some of the Pharisees in the crowd spoke to Jesus.

***Pharisee:*** Teacher, command your disciples to be quiet!

***Jesus:*** I tell you that if they keep quiet, the stones themselves will start shouting.

For the Gospel of the Lord **Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.**

## Reflection

Holy Week begins with Jesus taking his city not as a Roman governor would on a decked-out warhorse, but on a donkey, the beast of burden for all the poor. The crowd goes crazy, lining the streets with their clothes and palms and shouting Hosanna, which means 'save us'. By the end of the week things will be radically different. Jesus will die on the cross, virtually alone, nailed there by our sins. But one thing is certain: we will be saved.

- Pray for all who know the pain and desolation of being abandoned by friends and family. May they all find solace and comfort.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the CAPA, the Council of the Anglican Provinces of Africa.
