Dean's Desk

Today we celebrate St Anne's Day - feast of title for St Anne's Golden Beach, and also a significant day for St Anne's campus of Gippsland Grammar School. Welcome to staff and families of the school, including the Green Grubs (St Anne's alumni) and Old Scholars of the school. We're so glad you could join us today as part of our 10am service.

I attended the St Anne's Day Friday Fellowship at St Anne's this week, and heard stories over lunch about how boarders at St Anne's would troupe down to the Cathedral each Sunday for worship in their "crocodile" (two by two). The long association between the school and the Cathedral evokes many memories.



Most excitingly this week we took delivery of a grand piano, which was acquired through the generous bequest from Heather Castle's estate, a donation in memory of Beryl Morris, and some funds from the Roger Doyle bequest.

Mitchell will be playing the "new" piano today; I hope you'll agree with me about the profound difference between the old upright and the grand, with a greater range and depth of sound and tone colour. This piano is an exciting development which hopefully will facilitate being able to host concerts by professional artists, including Zachary Dunbar on the 28th September.

Yesterday I participated in my first General Synod gathering as a representative for the diocese. It was the first GS meeting held entirely online... And was effectively an online meeting held to deliberate a single piece of legislation deciding who could attend online meetings of GS. (You have permission to laugh! It does sound a bit like Dibley parish council, or something out of Yes, Minister!) It took us three hours to pass the proposed amendment.

I'll be away this coming week at the Deans' Conference in Perth.

The blue of the central shield and the lilies represented the purity and motherhood of the Virgin Mary. The Bishop's mitre is on top.

St Anne's Church of England Girls' Grammar School In the beginning ...

The Church of England Girls' School was founded in 1924 by the Right Reverend G. H. Cranswick, second Bishop of Gippsland. It began as a small, primary day school for girls in St Paul's Cathedral Hall, under the care of Deaconess Marie Sundell, and gradually increased and expanded into the lower secondary grades. In 1934 the name of the school was changed to "St Anne's Church of England Girls' Grammar School" and a new school badge was adopted. (above) The day-school moved to the Raymond Street site, formerly used as the boys' hostel, in March 1936, with the boarding and day school accommodated on the same site from 1937. In 1971 St Anne's Church of England Girls' Grammar School amalgamated with the Gippsland Grammar School.

Saint Anne is patroness of unmarried women, housewives, women in labor or who want to be pregnant, grandmothers, mothers and educators. She is also a patroness of horseback riders, cabinet-makers and miners.

St. Anne, the mother of the Virgin Mary, according to tradition derived from certain apocryphal writings. As the grandparents of Jesus, Anne and her husband Joachim are also considered the patron saints of grandparents; their feast day is celebrated on July 26.

Information concerning her life, which startlingly parallels the Old Testament story of the barren Hannah and her conception of the prophet Samuel in non-scriptural sources, Anne (Hebrew: Hannah) was born in Bethlehem in Judaea. She married Joachim, and they shared a wealthy and devout life at Nazareth. Grieved by her barrenness, Anne promised God that she would dedicate her firstborn child to the Lord's service. The couple then received a vision of an angel, who announced that Anne would conceive and bear a most wondrous child, Mary. When the child was three years old, Joachim and Anne, in fulfillment of her divine promise, brought Mary to the Temple of Jerusalem, where they left her to be brought up.
